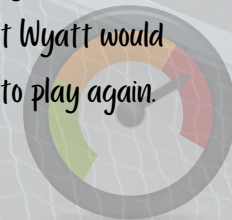

They share "I love yous" but Skylar's wrist is bad, so she has to withdraw from a national team game. She's okay with it, though because she's found her family.

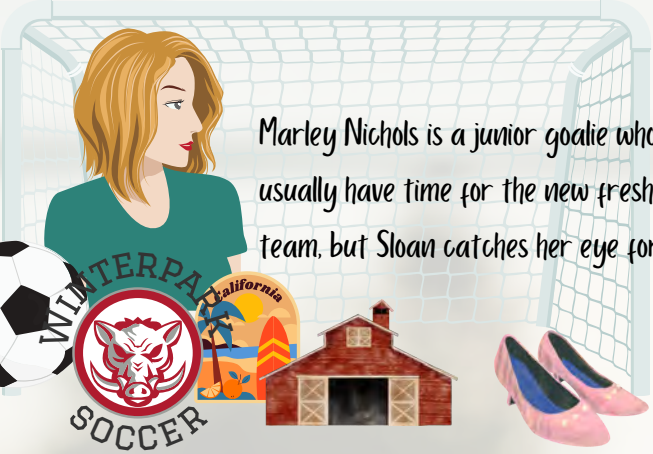

Layne Stoll chose Dunbar because it gave her the best shot to attend a decent school and get a basketball scholarship, which would help pay for the education she couldn't afford.

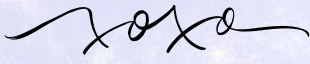


That makes her a little misunderstood on her **TEAM**.

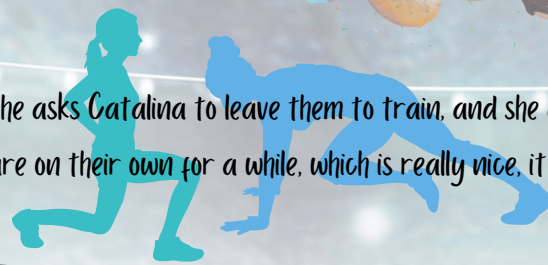


Belle doesn't want to take Chandler's offer, but her father convinces her. Belle joins Chandler in her hometown where she has her own rink.

She asks Catalina to leave them to train, and she and Belle are on their own for a while, which is really nice, it turns out.



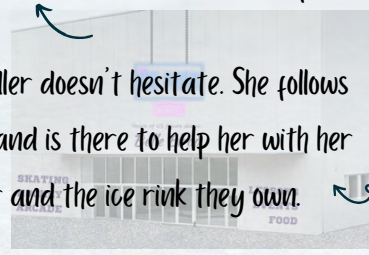

Chandler doesn't hesitate. She follows Belle and is there to help her with her father and the ice rink they own.



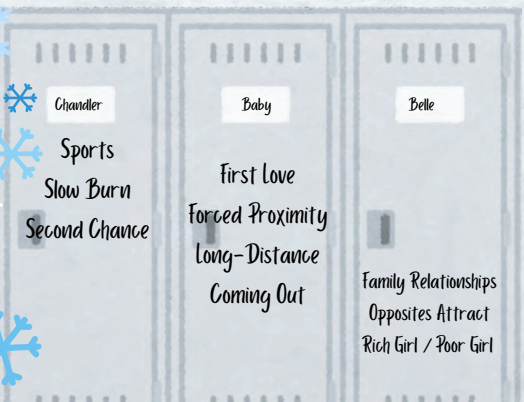
As the two grow closer and nearly take some big steps, Belle's father injures himself and she has to return home. They leave things in limbo.

Selma has had a crush on Drew for years now, but she doesn't seem to really like her now that Drew's in her resort "holding court" and bragging.

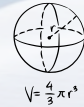


Drew doesn't understand why Selma has such a stick up her butt, but then, she meets Gia and is taken with the little girl who also happens to be Selma's daughter.

Selma's grandmother pushes her to say yes, and the two women have a great time together over the weekend.



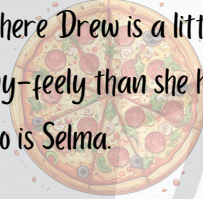
They continue to compete and both find out that they're on the shortlist for their respective Olympic teams.

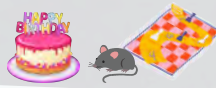
Selma comes out to Drew and they agree to go out on a date, which goes very well. They share their first kiss and later, their first time.

At the Olympics, Drew & Selma race against each other in the final. One wins gold. One wins silver. Then, Drew proposes.



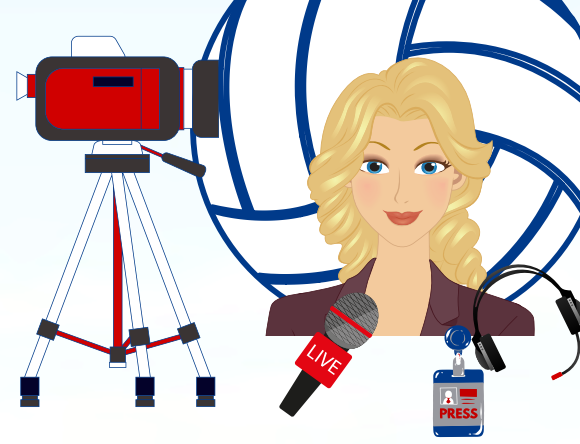
Selma's grandmother talks some sense into her, and she goes to Drew, telling her that she loves her and that she wants to make this work between them. **I love you**
